ISASH CONFERENCE LOCATION: GUIDE TO DOWNTOWN PORTLAND

This year, the conference location (Hilton- Downtown Portland) is in the heart of downtown Portland. The city is known to locals as the “Bridge City” due to the numerous bridges spanning the Willamette Reiver, most with pedestrian, bike, and vehicle options. The bridges are considered iconic landmarks. A few blocks away, visitors can find the Pioneer Courthouse square or go for a walk or run near the Willamette Riverfront. The Tilikum Crossing (a pedestrian and bike-only crossing) is 1.5 miles (~2.5 KM) from the hotel, making it a perfect 5K distance walking or running route. Pioneer Square is always bustling with events, local food cart cuisine, and is home to an iconic Starbucks location. On average, there are typically around 15-20 food carts stationed in the Square. There are also several great restaurants and breweries just a few blocks away from the hotel.
