# ISASH INTEREST GROUP SUCCESSFUL HOSTED AN IDEAS EXCHANGE WEBINAR ON APRIL 23

On April 23, 2025, ISASH's Family, Farmstead, & Leisure Time Interest Group hosted an Ideas Exchange Webinar. The webinar theme was, *Partners, Caregivers, and Champions: Women's Impact on Agricultural Health and Safety* and featured three amazing panelists including Florence Becot, Ph.D., Nationwide Insurance Early Career Professor Agricultural Safety and Health Program Lead at Penn State University; Sandra Contzen, Ph.D., Professor for Rural Sociology at the Bern University of Applied Sciences, School of Agricultural, Forest and Food Sciences in Switzerland; and Linda Emanuel, BSN, RN, Agricultural Producer and Agricultural Health Liaison with AgriSafe.

During the webinar, the presenters shared what motivates them to work in agricultural safety and health. They went on to share how their research or outreach work aims at shedding light on vital role woman play in the agriculture industry, what they know about that role, and any current gaps in meeting their safety and health needs. The panel also took a closer look at on why women are often viewed as the safety and health champions on farms and discussed changes or advancements they would you like to see in the agricultural industry to further empower and support women in their diverse roles.
